

Indigenous Literacy Day

Background:

Indigenous Literacy Day is an annual celebration of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Peoples' Stories, Cultures, and Languages, held on the first Wednesday of September.

The day is presented by the Indigenous Literacy Foundation, a national charity of the Australian Book Industry, working with remote Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Communities across Australia. Since 2011, the Foundation has gifted more than 750,000 books to these communities and published over 100 books reflecting Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander languages.
